Campaign Overview

It's hard to believe it's only been four weeks since Tower Hamlets' consultation to reverse the Liveable Streets schemes in Bethnal Green, Weavers, Brick Lane and Wapping ended on August 7th!

While we await the results of the consultation, we have been hard at work on **Phase Two of our campaign**. We expect the mayor will announce his decision at the next cabinet meeting on September 28th, and the consultation results would normally be published in the officer report feeding into that meeting. We have good reason to think that the mayor is set on ripping out the new street layouts whatever the consultation outcome (it's in the administration's strategic plan which they agreed at their August cabinet).

This past week we have seen one bollard removed on Clarkson St, which allows cars to cut across from Bethnal Green Road to Cambridge Heath Rd. Arnold Circus has seen fencing removed on the Club Row side, and the ANPR traffic camera on Antill Road in Bow has apparently been disabled.

Whatever the reason for this, it is a sign of what we think is the likely direction of travel for this administration unless we do everything in our power to get them to STOP, LISTEN and IMPROVE, as our petition demands, rather than rushing to remove the traffic reduction schemes.

This is why we must keep pushing in the next few weeks, before a decision is likely taken on September the 28th. The more people who support the campaign, the more impact it will have on the mayor and the council. So please look out for our calls to action and help us grow our voice and our influence. We have to show the mayor we are not just a small I handful of loud voices, we are a large and diverse community and we all want to keep our safer streets!

August in Review

Despite many of us being away in August, we have still accomplished a lot this month!

Petition

Our petition, spearheaded by Simon Ramsay, Headteacher at Oaklands School, went live on August 10th. It now stands at over 1,550 signatures, and it is still growing thanks to everyone who is helping us spread the word and grow our reach!

With your help, we are on track to reach 2,000 signatures in a few weeks, which should trigger a 30-minute debate at the next full council session on October 5th.

We have already started to prepare for the full council debate, so we are relying on you and our community across social media to keep our petition going so we can reach and smash through the 2,000 signature target!

Lobbying

Face-to-face conversations make a big difference! This month we have encouraged and helped neighbours to meet their councillors, often for the first time!

We have written a handy guide to attending a councillor surgery, and we have paired up first-timers with neighbours with more experience.

And we have had good conversations with councillors, which helps them really understand the many ways in which the street schemes have benefited the community.

Evidence

Disappointingly, Tower Hamlets have not responded to many of the FOI requests that we have put in. They are supposed to reply within 20 working days but almost a month later, many people are still waiting for replies.

Fortunately other organisations including the emergency services, Hackney Council and TFL have responded more quickly and so we have started to receive some data. From these FOIs we have some exciting preliminary results to share with you soon on topics such as emergency vehicle response times, traffic volumes and air quality, so watch this space!

TfL have <u>published their position</u> on Tower Hamlets' consultations to reverse the Liveable Streets schemes. Like us, they are concerned about the lack of evidence and the manner in which the consultation was carried out. If the council goes ahead with their plans to reopen the roads, they point out this will likely be detrimental to bus services and quality of life.



What's next?

- Stay tuned next week! We will be launching the third major pillar of our campaign, and we will really need support for this one!
- We are continuing to push ahead with the petition, councillor surgeries, and building a strong community of support around our safer streets, in preparation for the expected decision point on Wednesday 28th September.
- There will be opportunities to meet and greet at our upcoming events:
 - our community litter pick at Middleton Green on September 10th, 10-11am
 - the <u>Let's Play! kids' play session</u> at the pocket park on Old Bethnal Green Road by Middleton Green, on September 10th, 11am 12:30pm
- We've got new data and evidence to share with you, so watch this space!
